EXAMPLES IEP NURSING STATEMENTS For MA Billing

Because of CHLD's anxiety and depression issues she goes to the nurses office daily to receive medication in order for her to succeed during the school day.

CHLD goes to the Health office daily to receive her ADHS medication from a LPN. She needs this in order for her to succeed during the school day.

Individual Health Plan for G tube, seizures, and emergency exit procedures: CHLD is dependent on an adult for his mobility to safely exit the building if there were an emergency. Classroom staff will provide CHLD assistance in leaving the building.

The Individual Health Plan has been written and a nurse will supervise this service Because of CHLD's ADHD and anxiety, she will go to the health office daily to receive medication in order for her to be successful during the school day.

Due to CHLD's diagnosis of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, she goes to the nurses office daily to receive medication in order for him to be successful during his school day.

Medical conditions include pseudobulbar palsy and hypersalivation. During the school day CHLD wears a scarf that absorbs excess mucus and requires coordination for a storage location. She receives daily medication therapy which has been prescribed for administration during the school day. The Licensed School Nurse (LSN) will assist with care coordination with the multiple community providers for health management needs. The LSN will complete a health assessment of student needs and review of records annually and as medically necessary. an health assessment yearly.

CHLD's team will have access to the expertise of the school district nurse and building health assistant to handle colostomy/urostomy CHLD will also see the school nurse one time a day for medication delivery.

CHLD will have access to the Health Office at all times when feeling/actually "low" or "high" or CGM (continuous Glucose monitor) alarming.

Nursing is a necessary related service for Diabetes management. Direct and Indirect nursing services are required for medication administration and management and nursing evaluation: assessment and diagnostic testing; review of health status; identification of health hazards and actual or potential health needs; evaluation of health behavior; and physical, emotional, and psychological health. The duration of these services may be modified by the parent or provider when necessary.
